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Rationale	The purpose of this policy is to promote healthy, safe, inclusive and hope-filled KEM school communities, committed to respect for the sacred dignity and thriving of each student.
	KEM recognises that promoting the health and wellbeing of students is imperative and is therefore committed to providing a positive and supportive learning environment.
	KEM also recognises that the health and flourishing of each individual member can affect the flourishing of all other members of KEM communities. This policy emphasises cooperation, inclusion and connectedness.
Principles and Values	Welcome Inspired by the Gospel teachings of love, justice and peace, KEM schools welcome all into their diverse communities. KEM schools cultivate a strong understanding of different cultures and religions and promote freedom from discrimination of any kind for all community members.
	<b>Right relationships</b> KEM schools are models of faith communities where co-creative and life- giving relationships with God and others enable all to collaborate and grow in community.
	<b>Common good</b> All KEM schools work towards achieving the common good. This entails the promotion of deep understanding, prayerful reflection and a willingness to act with courageous integrity.
	<b>Empowerment</b> All members of KEM school communities are empowered to act as positive participants of society, with attitudes inspired by Gospel teachings. Motivated by life-long learning, they will be robust enquirers and respectful challengers, with a deep understanding of their place in the world.
Audience	The audience for this document is the Board and Secretariat of KEM, personnel employed or engaged in the KEM schools, students and the wider school communities.
Definitions	<b>Wellbeing</b> is the state of being comfortable, healthy and happy. It is what is intrinsically good for the individual. In a school context it is about a

	young person being physically, emotionally and psychologically engaged with the school community so that they can enjoy successful learning.
Procedure	<ul> <li>KEM will enact this policy by requiring school communities to establish practices that keep students happy, healthy, safe and ready to learn.
