### **Social Media and Protecting Children**

Social media provides many benefits in fostering community engagement and in keeping in touch with relatives and friends, especially when we cannot be together physically as we have experienced recently. Unfortunately, there is also the potential to cause harm, especially when the user remains anonymous to bully, intimidate, ridicule and demean another.

We have addressed behaviours this week with students creating inappropriate videos or images on Tik Tok to demean, embarrass or belittle other students. While those involved in the creation of these sites may be only a very small number of students, the impact can often have widespread impact. Some of these videos were created over the Easter/holiday break and have continued into Term 2. We have been clear with students about the need to protect all students and that these sites must be removed immediately. I would especially like to congratulate and thank the students who quickly brought this to our attention for their care for others

in our community. Use of the mobile phone in Year 7-10 is currently under review pending any further concerns with social media and online bullying. While we would like students to learn from this experience and take responsibility and ownership for their behaviour online in keeping with our College values, our highest priority is child protection.

I seek the support of all parents in partnership with the school to address this matter and to please check your child's online profile. Sometimes children will not disclose they are being bullied or harassed, or may not know how to respond and report the matter. There are a number of websites with helpful information including [esafety.gov.au](http://esafety.gov.au) and Cyberbullying (for parents at [kidshealth.org](http://kidshealth.org)). I thank you for your support in this matter and students develop and learn the most appropriate ways to communicate with compassion.
