Subject Selection Night

Thank you to all the parents and students who attended our Subject Selection evening last Tuesday night. This is an important part in empowering students to be invested in their own learning and career pathway. The timetable for 2023

is changing. Following our very long review process, we are moving to a five-period day. The new timetable prioritises Literacy and Numeracy and increases time for all Senior subjects. Year 10 students who are progressing well will have an opportunity to study one senior subject, thereby lessening their workload later on. Subject Selection is due no later than Friday 12th August.

Staff Employment 2023

Next year, the demand for staffing in all schools will be at a premium. Proposed changes to conditions in Victoria will increase educational staffing needs. Child Safety and the Ministerial Order 1359.

Marian College Child Protection Officers (CPOs)

Broad areas of responsibility of the CPO are to:

PROVIDE AUTHORITATIVE ADVICE

Act as a source of support, advice and expertise to staff on matters of child safety. Liaise with the principal and school leaders to maintain the visibility of child safety. Lead the development of the school's child safety culture, including being a child safety champion and providing coordination in communicating, implementing, monitoring, enhancing and reporting on strategies to embed a culture of child safety.

RAISE AWARENESS

Ensure the school's policies are known and used appropriately. Ensure the school's child safety policy is reviewed in the context of school self-evaluation undertaken as part of the school accountability framework. Ensure the child protection policy is available publicly and parents are aware of the fact that referrals about suspected abuse or neglect may be made and the role of the school in this. Be alert to the specific needs of children in need, those with special educational needs and young carers. Encourage among all staff a culture of listening to children and taking account of their wishes and feelings in any measures to protect them.

Our College Child Protection Officers are: Mrs Steph Saravanja (Head of Wellbeing), Mrs Mary-Lou Boatman (Head of House) and Mrs Emma Dawes (Psychologist). Please feel free to speak to them in confidence or contact DHHS or the police in matters of Child Safety.

Circuit Break Weekend

With the flu, COVID and other ailments at a premium this term, the 11th and 12th of August are designed as a mid-term circuit breaker, for students and staff to recharge the batteries and forge ahead for the remainder of the term. This is


After my family's move to Ararat, I found myself going to what is now called the Ararat


